General Information of Institution

1.1 HISTORY OF SONGKHLA VOCATIONAL COLLEGE

Songkhla Vocational College is located on the state property. The college had a total area of 7 rai and 6.8 square wa. In 1975, the college got the permission from the State Railway of Thailand to use the land of the State Railway of Thailand. This land had a total area of 4 rai, 1 ngan, and 50 square wa. In present, the college has a total area of 11 rai, 1 ngan, and 56.8 square wa. On September 1st, 1938, this college was called “School of Sewing Clothes of Songkhla.” This school was under the Department of Curriculum and Instruction Development, Ministry of Justice. The students who graduated from 4th grade could enroll in the sewing clothes or weavers major. The different plan had a separate place for studying described as following:

- Sewing Clothes Major was located on the lower level of resident hall in education department of Songkhla. (In the present, the land is now known as Boromrajonani College of Nursing Songkhla.)
 - In 1939, received budget to build one study hall and weavers building, where was the location of the college in the present. The two majors were moved to study together in the same area.
 - In 1940, received budget to build one study hall and weavers building.
 - In 1947, the name of the school was changed to “Songkhla Woman’s School”, under the Division of School of Mechanics, the Department of Vocational Education, Ministry of Education. This school only provided education for woman, which was called “Primary Vocational Education” plan. The students who graduated from 4th grade could enroll in this program.
 - In 1949, extended curriculum to 2 levels, which were primary vocational education (2-year program), and secondary vocational education (3-year program). The students who graduated from 9th grade or equivalent could enroll in the program. In total, it was a 5-year program to complete the entire program, which was equal to study the middle and high school program of the ordinary line.

- In 1956, extended curriculum for 3 more years, which was called high vocational school. The students who graduated from grade 12th or equal could enroll in this program and cancelled middle school curriculum.
- In 1961, changed curriculum based on National Education Plan (1960) into high school curriculum for vocational plan. The students who were qualified to enroll had to graduate from 12th grade or equivalent (3-year program).
- In 1964, participated in Improving Institute Project of the Department of Vocational Education and UNICEF organization. This project supported the school to revise and improve curriculum for teachers in different subjects, including supporting teaching material. There were 4 subject majors which were (1) fabric and sewing major, (2) food and nutrition major, (3) home economics major, and (4) arts and crafts major.
- In 1965, allow male to enroll in the program.
- In 1973, changed the named to “Songkhla Vocational School”
- In 1975, asked for the permission from the State Railway of Thailand to use their land. The area that was asked for had 4 rai, 1 ngan, and 50 square wa. The total area of the school was 11 rai, 1 ngan, and 56.8 square wa.
- In 1974, education plan was used high school curriculum in home economics plan. The school accepted the students who graduated and held Vocation Certificate degree. After completing this program the students received the High Vocational Certificate degree. This school was changed to “Songkhla Vocational College,” District 2, which was combined with “Songkhla Technicology School District 1.”
- In 1976, opened the plan for teaching commercial.
- In 1979, separated from “Songkhla Vocational College District 2” to become known as “Songkhla Vocational College.” The students who studied in the commercial major of “Songkhla Technicology School District 1” were transferred to continue studying in “Songkhla Vocational College.”
- In 1982, applied art major was opened. This major started to accept the students into the program in 1984.

- In 1984, offered Technical Certificate degrees in 4 majors consisted of (1) General Home Economics, (2) Business Computer, (3) Service Business, and (4) Accounting.
- In 1983 – 1989, received the budget to build three new four story buildings, which were building for students and undergraduate students in Home Economics major, Food and Nutrition major, Fabric and Clothing major. In present, these buildings are lecture hall 2, 3, and 4.
- In 1987, received the budget to build “Chalermprakiet Auditorium” and building 6.
- In 1987 – 1989, received the budget to build “Administration Building.”
- In 1990, received the budget the build a resident hall for teachers. It was the 4 story flat with 14 units.
- In 1994, received the budget to build a resident hall for janitors. It was the 4 story flat with 14 units. Started to offers Certificate degree in Public Relations.
- In 1995, received 400,000 baths as the budget from Member of the House of Representatives, Democrat Party to build a resident hall for parents. In the present, this building was demolished and turned into the multipurpose laboratory building including durable articles (Hotel building). In the same year, the college offered Certificate degree in tourist industry and Dual degree in hotel. Also, the college offered High Vocational Certificate degree (part-time program) in accounting.
- 1996, received 5,695,000 baths as the budget to build the school building and the 4 story teacher’s resident hall (consisted of 14 units). After that, the college received 28,800,000 baths as the budget to build a 6 story lecture and laboratory hall. In the present, it is the lecture hall called “Singhalakorn College of Technology and Management.” At the same time, the college started to offered High Vocational Certificate degree in Marketing (Part-time program).
- In 1997, received 8,090,000 baths as the budget to build “Academic Resource Center.” In the present, this building is the lecture hall of “Singhalong College of Technology and Management (Ratan President of Nakhonratchasima).”

- In 1998, Songkhla Vocational College opened extended campus called “Singhalong Campus (Ratan President of Nakhonratchasima).” This campus became the second campus of the college located in Muang Ngam sub-district, Singhalong district, Songkha province. Twenty-five rai of the campus was donated from Ratan President of Nakhonratchasima. The college extended campus area by buying 1 rai, 3 ngan, and 36 square wa. The total area of the campus was 26 rai, 3 ngan, and 36 square wa.
- In 2004, received the budget to build the “88 years Ratan President of Nakhonratchasima Ratan Hall.” The budget to build this building was 19,790,000 baths. In the present, this building is used as lecture hall of Singhalong College of Technology and Management (Ratan President of Nakhonratchasima).
- In 2007, got the building for distributing products that was built by the foundation of Ratan President of Nakhonratchasima. The budget that was used for build this building was 815,000 baths. In the present, this building is the lecture hall of Singhalong College of Technology and Management (Ratan President of Nakhonratchasima).
- In 2008, received 6,392,201.09 baths as a budget for building the “ 70 years Lecture Hall”.
- In 2009, Singhalong Campus (Ratan President of Nakhonratchasima) of Songkhal Vocational College separated and turned into a new college called Singhalong College of Technology and Management (Ratan President of Nakhonratchasima). The first president of the college was Mr. Surapol Eiam-sum-ang.
- In 2010, received the budget to build the multipurpose building including durable articles (Hotel Building). The budget for building this hall was 25,000,000 baths.
- In 2014, received 9,094,000 baths as the budget to build the “Academic Resource Center” (Lecture hall 7). The total area of this hall was 1,088 square meters.

In the present, Songkhla Vocational College offers Vocational Certificate degrees as the regular programs in 5 majors consists of (1) Commercial program, (2) Art program, (3) Home Economics program, (4) Tourist Industry and Dual program. High Vocational Certificate degrees are offered in 3 majors, which consist of (1) Business Administration program, (2) Home Economics program, and (3) Tourist Industry.

Ta Baek is a deciduous plant. The average height of the tree is 15 – 30 meters. It is a simple leaf that grows opposite side of each other. The leaves that start to grow have short soft hair covering the leaf. The hair that covers the leaves will disappear when the leaves grow older. The blade is similar to spear shape. The tip of the leaf is an acute angle. The leaf base rolls into the middle. The petals are purple-pink and turn to be white later. The panicles bloom at the end of the branch.

- Sema Dhamma means goodness
- Lion Throne means stability
- Sasiprapha (Flame of the Buddha) under the Sema Dhamma means the light of wisdom
- Number 1 (inside of the flame) means superior of wisdom

- Blossom lotus grows upon the water (both sides) means having wisdom
- Flamingo (Karnongpleaw) (The origin of flame) means the light that is bright forever.
- Alphabets: (ท)Thu, (ส)Sor, (ณ)Ni, (ม)Mor (under the symbol are the abbreviation of the Four Noble Truths consist of dukkha, samudaya, nirodha, and magga) means the four noble truths
- Around the circle has the phrase, “The Vocational Education Commission,” both in Thai and English
- The meaning of the symbol of the Vocational Education Commission is the superior of wisdom based on the stability and goodness that are surrounding with the Four Noble of Truths. The Four Noble of Truths consist of dukkha, samudaya, nirodha, and magga. Also, the light of the wisdom that is continuing developed.
